## City Gearing Up for Eventful 2015

Exciting things are in store for Marysville during the upcoming year. The former DTE site which was sold to Commercial Development Company of St. Louis, Missouri in May 2014 will see the most significant change. The power plant is being demolished, the land abated then sold to a future developer yet-to-be determined. The site is zoned IRO/PUD which means anything from light industrial to retail to a major attraction could be located on the site.

Harsen's Island Brewery, located at the former Hostess building at 808 Gratiot, has an anticipated spring opening date. The taproom and brewery will serve lite fare food and will have an indoor 50-seat capacity and 30-seat capacity on its patio. Neighboring Dollar General at 818 Gratiot is constructing a new building at 818 Gratiot and has recently opened.

On the industrial front SMR recently finished constructing its new paint facility and plans to hire more than 100 people in the coming year. One of the world's largest manufacturers of passenger car rear view mirrors, SMR has planned the new facility's grand opening for January 21. The city's industrial park is also experiencing growth as Ellery Tool and Die locates to the corner of Mills and Wills Streets. Ellery is a tooling and stamping company which produces items for the automotive, military and consumer industries.

Along the riverfront Phase 2 of the Chrysler Beach project will begin this summer. Residents and visitors can anticipate seeing a new playground, upgraded bathroom facilities and a fish cleaning station. At the Veteran's Memorial a new shuffleboard court will be installed from funds awarded by the Gannett Foundation this past December. A recent study of our park indicated that many senior citizens use our park facilities. The anticipated construction date is May 2015. Cuttle Creek will undergo restoration in our golf course. ## City Manager's Comments—2014 Year in Review

2014 proved to be an exciting year for the City of Marysville. Below are some of the highlights:

- **Water Department:** \$5.6 million water plant renovation completed; 14th Street water tower repaired and upgraded.
- **Wastewater Department:** Northend pumping station built at Ravenswood and Gratiot—rather than sending captured flow generated by Marysville to Port Huron, pumping station will send waste to our wastewater plant for processing ultimately saving the City money.
- **Police Department:** Hired new patrolman to replace retiring sergeant.
- **Fire Department:** Refurbishing 1995 ladder truck.
- **Public Safety:** Our Police and Fire Departments, in conjunction with the Marysville Business Council, hosted a pancake breakfast benefitting S.O.S. Food Pantry.
- **Finance/Treasury:** Began accepting debit/credit card payments at City Hall. *(A 3% processing fee will apply.)*
- **Golf Course:** Liquor license obtained—effective for 2015 season; Cuttle Creek Restoration Project began—\$2.4 million EPA grant will go toward removing irrigation pond, re-establishing stream channel for fish, restoring habitat to natural state, building pedestrian bridge.
- **Recreation:** Pavilion constructed at Marysville City Park; Chrysler Beach gazebo available for rental on weekends; new K9 5K walk/run attracts nearly 200 people and 100 dogs—proceeds benefitted Recreation Department and SCC Humane Society's SNAP Program.
- **Department of Public Service:** Columbarium wall built creating 80 new niches; damaged panels replaced on 6th Street; in-kind work performed at Chrysler Beach (parking lot and boat ramp demolition).
- **Community Development:** Shoreline Restoration Project receives the American Society of Civil Engineers' Quality of Life Project Awards for Southeastern Michigan and State of Michigan; Chrysler Beach Phase 1 began—parking lot repaved, rain gardens installed, boat ramp renovated and widened, dock decking/framing replaced, pedestrian bridges constructed.

Season passes may be purchased at Marysville City Hall, 1111 Delaware Avenue in the Treasurer's Office. Cash or check made payable to the 'City of Marysville' will be accepted. Debit or credit Visa, MasterCard, Discover or American Express are also accepted however a 3% processing fee will be charged.

Golfers who are age 55 by April 1, 1960 are eligible for the senior rates. To purchase a college student pass, purchaser must demonstrate that student is attending school full time (12 credit hours or more). Please bring a transcript or class schedule for verification. ## Gazebo/Park Pavilions/Ball Fields Available for Rental

Beginning April 1 the Recreation Department will begin taking **resident** reservations for park pavilions, Chrysler Beach gazebo and Morton Ball Fields. Non-resident reservations will begin May 1. Park pavilion fees are \$35/day for residents and \$70/ day for non-residents. The gazebo may be rented in two hour increments for \$35/day for residents and \$70/day for non-residents. Morton Fields fees are \$20/day for residents and \$40/day for non-residents.

## Property Assessment Notice Information

The 2015 Taxable Value (assessment) Notices will be mailed to you by the end of February 2015. On March 15, 1994 Michigan voters approved a constitutional amendment known as Proposal A. This amendment was designed to limit the growth of property taxes to the Inflation Rate Multiplier, until ownership of the property is transferred. Prior to Proposal A, property taxes were based upon the state equalized value (SEV). With Proposal A, the taxable value is the value on which property taxes are now based. For 2015 the Inflation Rate Multiplier is 1.6%.

Generally speaking, unless the current year’s SEV is less than the previous year’s taxable value multiplied by the Inflation Rate Multiplier, the current year’s taxable value will increase by the Inflation Rate Multiplier. If there was a transfer of ownership in 2014, the 2015 SEV and Taxable Value will be the same.

### Actual sale price is not necessarily the true cash value of a property

The law defines the True Cash Value as the usual selling price of a property. The legislature and courts have stated that the actual selling price of a property is not a controlling factor in the True Cash Value or State Equalized Value as calculated by the Assessor. For this reason, when analyzing the sales for the assessment changes, non-representative sales were excluded from the analysis.

The following is a basic example of how to calculate your annual property tax for those with 100% Principal Residence Exemption (PRE) status:

$$\text{TAXABLE VALUE} \times (\text{TENTATIVE}) \text{ PRE-MILLAGE RATE}^* = (\text{TENTATIVE}) \text{ TOTAL YEARLY TAX}$$

## News from the Treasurer’s Office

**Now Accepting Payment with Debit or Credit Cards!:** For your convenience, the Treasurer’s Office now accepts payments in the form of debit or credit. Please note that an additional 3% fee will be charged by the processing company.

**Winter Tax Bills:** Winter tax bills have been mailed and are due on February 17, 2015. Tax bills paid through escrow are not mailed to the homeowner. A copy of the bill can be obtained on our website at [www.cityofmarysvillemi.com](http://www.cityofmarysvillemi.com). 2014 taxes not paid by February 28, 2015 will be forwarded to the St. Clair County Treasurer.

**Water/Sewer/Refuse Bills:** Water/sewer/refuse bills have been mailed and are due January 31, 2015. The current flat rate charge is \$354.14 for six months.

**Dog Licenses:** St. Clair County dog licenses are being sold through Friday, February 27, 2015. Please bring proof of rabies vaccination if your dog’s vaccine has expired. \$12 for spayed/neutered dogs; \$22 for intact dogs. Please make checks payable to the *City of Marysville*.

**Marysville Golf Course Memberships:** Season passes for the 2015 golf season are now available **only** in the Treasurer’s office. Purchase your pass on or before March 15, 2015 to receive a \$50 discount. Referral rebates also available. Visit [www.cityofmarysvillemi.com/golf-course/2015-rates](http://www.cityofmarysvillemi.com/golf-course/2015-rates) for more information.

**Senior Citizen Water/Sewer Discount:** Senior citizens age 65 and older who own and occupy their homes from which they derive no income and have a total household income in the prior calendar year of \$20,000 or less are eligible for a 30% discount on the water/sewer portion of their bill. The refuse charge is not eligible for discount. Applications are available in our Treasurer’s office and an itemization of the total household income or copy of last year’s MI-1040CR form is required. Condominium owners whose water/sewer bills are paid by their condominium association are to make application prior to June 15 for the July billing and prior to November 15 for the December billing.

**Tax Deferment:** Senior citizens age 62, eligible veterans, paraplegics, quadriplegics, totally disabled, and blind persons having a total household income in the prior calendar year of \$40,000 or less, may file an affidavit with the Treasurer after June 1 and before September 15 to defer payment of summer taxes. This means that the summer taxes can be paid at the same time as the winter taxes without penalty. Ask your Treasurer to assist you with this deferment.

## Marysville Trash Guidelines

- **Wednesday is our city’s scheduled pick-up day.** Trash, recycling, yard waste and bulky items must be placed at the curb by 7 a.m. on Wednesday to be removed that day. Our ordinance prohibits placement before 6 p.m. the night before. No larger than a 32-gallon trash can is permitted. The time of day refuse will be removed may vary depending on the volume of refuse being disposed of in the city.
- **Bulky Items:** Place by curb before 7 a.m. on Wednesday year-round. Call the DPS at (810) 364-8340 to check if an item is acceptable.
- **Paint: *Must be completely dried.*** To dry, please leave the lid off and put cat litter inside can to absorb paint. Set it *next* to your trash can.
- **Yard Waste:** Place grass clippings, leaves or small branches in a trash can marked with an “X” or in brown composting bags. Branches four feet or shorter may be in a neat pile next to the yard waste can for pick up. ***The first day for yard waste pick-up this year is Wednesday, April 1!***

## Recycling Guidelines

Our recycling guidelines have changed! Our refuse contractor Emterra now takes the items listed below. Recycling (in your blue or lime green container, one per household) will be picked up on Wednesdays.

### ITEMS ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING:

- GLASS – any color beverage bottles or jars. Rinse clean and discard lid, labels need not be removed.
- CANS – Tin or aluminum – soup, vegetable, fruit cans, etc. *Rinse clean and remove labels.*
- PLASTIC – **#1 - #8 ACCEPTED!** Rinse clean and discard caps.
- NEWSPAPER – In addition to regular newspaper, glossy prints/ads are now accepted.
- CHIP/PAPER BOARD – Cereal, tissue boxes, etc. now accepted. *Please breakdown boxes!*
- MIXED OFFICE WASTE – Junk mail, flyers, office paper, magazines, phone books now accepted.
- CARDBOARD – Please ensure cardboard is cut to the size of newspaper and fits in bin. ***NO PIZZA BOXES, PLEASE!!!***

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD may also be dropped off at our DPS yard, 200 East 14th Street. *Cardboard only-no packaging.*

## Sidewalk Snow Removal

Our DPS crew no longer plows sidewalks. Be kind and remove the snow and ice from your sidewalk for school children, walkers, letter carriers, etc. Snow and ice accumulation must be removed within 48 hours after a storm. Residents who leave town for the winter should make snow removal arrangements. For those who are elderly or disabled, please call (810) 455-1301 to receive snow removal assistance information.

### Severe Weather

All thunderstorms are dangerous. Every thunderstorm produces lightning. While lightning fatalities have decreased over the past 30 years, lightning continues to be one of the top three storm-related killers. Other associated dangers of thunderstorms include [tornadoes](#), strong winds and hail.



To prepare for a thunderstorm, you should do the following:

- [Build an emergency kit](#) that includes flashlight, portable radio and spare batteries;
- Remove dead or rotting trees and branches that could fall and cause injury or damage during a severe thunderstorm;
- Secure outdoor objects that could blow away or cause damage;
- Get inside a home, building or hard top automobile (not a convertible). Although you may be injured if lightning strikes your car, you are much safer inside a vehicle than outside.;
- Close window blinds, shades or curtains and secure outside doors; and
- Unplug any electronic equipment well before the storm arrives.

### Pedestrian Safety

With spring temperatures we find ourselves outside more enjoying the weather, exercising or walking to school. In Michigan, more than 100 pedestrians die each year being struck by vehicles. Most of these deaths occur between 6 p.m. and midnight, with many fatalities occurring when pedestrians cross the roadway somewhere other than at an intersection. Pedestrians should:

- Use sidewalks whenever available;
- Obey traffic signals;
- Never cross mid-block. Cross streets at a corner, using crosswalks whenever possible;
- Look left-right-left before crossing a street and continue looking while crossing;
- Make eye contact with drivers prior to crossing in front of them;
- Never assume the vehicle driver can see you;
- Wear reflective clothing and carry a flashlight when walking at night or in the early morning; and
- Never allow children under age 10 to cross the streets alone. Young children do not have the skills to accurately judge traffic risks.

Local roads will also be a focus in 2015. The City anticipates rehabilitating or reconstructing pavement for five locations. The locations are as follows:

- Lynwood / St. Lawrence: Approximately 0.39 miles from Gratiot to Busha;
- Virginia / 8<sup>th</sup> Street / Indiana: Approximately 0.25 miles north of 9<sup>th</sup> Street;
- New Hampshire: Approximately 0.78 miles from 18<sup>th</sup> Street to Huron;
- Vermont: Approximately 0.60 miles from 17<sup>th</sup> Street to Huron; and
- Delaware: Approximately 0.81 miles from Huron to Gratiot.
