

Proclamation

City of Marysville

Whereas, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

Whereas, this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska and Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and

Whereas, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife; and

Whereas, the City of Marysville recognizes the value of trees and forests and realizes the importance of people improving environmental quality in their communities.

Now Therefore, I, Daniel A. Damman, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Marysville do hereby proclaim April 29th 2016 as

ARBOR DAY

in the City of Marysville and call upon all citizens to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands and further urge them to plant trees to gladden the hearts of and promote the well - being of this and future generations.
