Mayor Damman stated that city administration is looking into whether overtime costs incurred when mowing grass at homes and businesses that have violated the Noxious Weed Ordinance can be put into the budget.

MAYOR & COUNCIL/MANAGER COMMENTS:

Council Member Wessel offered his thoughts and prayers in remembrance of September 11, 2001.

Mayor Pro-Tem Pyden echoed Council Member Wessel's sentiments and mentioned that Marysville residents were recognized in the top 250 communities in Michigan as being fiscally secure and responsible.

Council Member Hayman praised the River Road Flag Team headed by John and Ketha Knuth. Flags are placed along River Road on Memorial Day, 4th of July, and Labor Day. Sentiments for 9/11 were expressed and her concern for the hurricane victims in Texas and Florida.

Council Member Buggy thanked all the first responders for their service.

Council Member Barber commented on September 11, 2001 and gave his sympathy to Mrs. McDonald on the loss of her husband.

City Manager Fernandez mentioned that he had reached out to a fellow Harvard classmate who was a first responder in New York during the attacks on the World Trade Center.

Mayor Damman commented how the world was changed in one day on September 11th; thanked all the first responders who are front and center day after day; thanked Marysville Assembly of God for honoring 1st responders and also for providing prayer support for council meetings; thanked Miss Michigan Heather Kendrick for representing the city and state well; and reminded everyone to drive carefully and watch for children walking and new drivers on the road now that school is back in session.
