Mayor Pro-Tem Dunn let citizens know that AT&T U-Verse is now available in Marysville.

Council Member Barber commented that he is in favor of reducing the speed limit on River Road in response to a citizen's request from last meeting, gave kudos to Julie Sobkowski for the fine job on the Newsletter and mentioned new classes the Recreation Department is offering.

City Manager Randall Fernandez introduced Patty Samar, Editor of the Blue Water Woman Magazine, who then in turn presented Council Member Rita Hendricks with the Blue Water Civic Leader of the Year Award.

Council Member Buggy expressed admiration for the courage it took for Mr. Lutz to address the Council.
