TOPICS DISCUSSED:

1. Opening remarks were given by City Manager Randy Fernandez welcoming the Planning Commission and Recreation Board to the meeting and inviting their comments and participation.
2. Mayor Damman led the discussion with the City Council, Planning Commission and Recreation Board on the needs going forward for a Recreation/Community Center containing classrooms, a gymnasium and a kitchen. It was made clear that tax rates are not increasing, tax revenues are increasing somewhat. Needs versus wants were discussed and also keeping in mind the facilities available through the school district. The discussion touched current school facility usage, scheduling and availability concerns. Also discussed was the possibility of combining a Recreation/Community Center with a new City Hall and Museum. Current buildings are old and expensive to maintain and do not necessarily meet the current needs. It was also brought up that the current Community Center is unsafe and probably should have been torn down years ago. The Recreation Board was left with the task of determining what the needs are going forward for a new building.
3. Brian Lents, Marysville Golf Course, gave a presentation on the budget, season pass sales, progress on the Cuttle Creek project, irrigation problems and solutions, projections for beer and liquor sales and the upcoming opening of the Crossfire Grill.
