CITIZENS TO BE HEARD:

1. T. Earl, 1420 New Jersey, commented that the blight in the city seems to have gotten worse over the past five years and wonders what can be done about it. Management responded and they will discuss the matter further after the council meeting.
2. L. Curley, 525 18<sup>th</sup> Street, remarked that with the expansion at SMR and the added turn lane on 18<sup>th</sup> Street there has been more traffic and road noise which has affected the residents' quality of life. Management responded.
