CONSENT AGENDA:

Moved by Council Member Pyden, supported by Council Member Buggy to approve the Consent Agenda:

1. Approved minutes of the Regular Meeting held on April 27, 2015.

ACTION AGENDA:

1. Moved by Council Member Wessel, supported by Council Member Hendricks to approve bills in the amount of \$221,717.44 and electronic payments of \$17,343.84 and payroll for May 22, 2015. Motion passed unanimously.
2. Moved by Council Member Hendricks, supported by Mayor Pro-Tem Dunn to approve recommendation to accept the lowest cost responsive bid in the amount of \$45,585.00 from McKenzie Concrete of North Street, Michigan for Public Safety concrete repair on condition the sentence, "Concrete should not be driven on right away if it can not guarantee against cracking" shall be stricken and the amendment that "all pavement shall be able to be driven on in 24 hours and all work will be completed by June 30, 2015" shall be added. Motion passed unanimously.

MAYOR& COUNCIL/MANAGER COMMENTS:

Council Member Pyden commented on the new Crossfire Grill, mentioned the need to try and coordinate building/gym use with the school district and churches for recreation programs, and communicate to the public the upcoming road repairs.

Council Member Hendricks supports the idea of educating residents on road projects and sharing the vision for future planning; mentioned that DTE is purchasing bike racks; and noted that she will be joining with participants in the county wide Ride of Silence that honors bicyclists that have been killed.

Council Member Buggy stated that the council looks at everything that is going on and prioritizes projects and promotes the good things that are happening in the city.

Council Member Barber noted that the Detroit newspaper mentioned the DTE site in a recent article, stated that this is National Police Week and thanked Chief Konik and all of the Marysville police officers for the safe community provided in the wake of recent police shootings and unrest around the country.

Mayor Damman urged residents to read the Keeping In Touch article regarding a Municipal Campus and thanked the police department for all they do in providing safety for all residents.
