

MINUTES OF THE MARYSVILLE CITY COUNCIL GOAL SETTING SESSION HELD ON
MONDAY, JUNE 20, 2016 AT 6:30 P.M. AT CITY HALL,

AGENDA AMENDMENTS:

1. Liquor license extending to Meijer Gas Station was added to the list of discussion items.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. Several local party store owners attended the goal setting session to voice their concern over HB4895 which was signed into law by the state in April and how this will affect their businesses. The law allows for a secondary location permit to sell beer and wine at retailers with motor fuel pumps. Mayor Damman assured the business owners that the city would do whatever it could, but made no promises since this was done at the state level. The city will investigate whether it has any options in this matter.
2. Acting City Manager Renae Warnke gave opening remarks.
3. Adrianna Melchior, HRC, gave an update on the building improvements to be made at City Hall and the Public Safety Building. The roofs at both buildings will be replaced in FY17 along with some other minor repairs which have already begun. Beyond that, more information will be needed to make a decision on what is needed before renovating the second floor of City Hall.
4. An amendment to Chapter 105 – Nuisances, Article VIII – Parking and Storage of Recreational Vehicles and Equipment and Other Items was presented for discussion with the intention of introducing the ordinance at the June 27th council meeting. After discussion it was decided that the ordinance as presented would need to be amended to limit the number of vehicles that can be parked in the driveway. Corporate counsel will be contacted to make the change which will be introduced at the next council meeting.

5. Water/Wastewater Updates by Bari Wrubel were tabled.

6. Annette DeMaria from ECT gave options for waterfront parking. The boat trailer parking along the river front will be relocated and those spots will be turned back into car parking. The additional boat trailer parking will be in the city park with a flashing light to aid in crossing the street. Additional parking for the beach area was also discussed with the possibility of constructing a new parking area on the west side of River Road.
