1. J. Morrison, 810 St. Paul thanked the clerk's office, DPW workers, Gardens School janitorial staff and all the election inspectors for their hard work during the recent presidential election.
2. J. Vokes, 996 St. Joseph stated that there are some trees on St. Joseph that have fallen and could be dangerous and that the flag at the Public Safety Building is torn.

MAYOR & COUNCIL/MANAGER COMMENTS:

Mayor Pro-Tem Pyden reminded everyone that parking is prohibited on any streets between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. beginning December 1, the last day for x barrels is November 30, leave pickup will continue through the first week of December and to contact Stefanie DeNardin in the Recreation Department if sidewalk shoveling is needed by the elderly or disabled.

Council Member Hendricks mentioned that Christmas in the Park will be judged on Wednesday evening with the winner announced Saturday at the parade.

Council Member Hayman remarked how beautiful the decorations are along River Road and in the Marysville Park and to not forget the Santa Parade on Saturday.

Council Member Buggy brought up that the golf course is now closed for the season and thanked the group of volunteers who have worked tirelessly on rebuilding some of the tees.

Council Member Barber recognized and thanked the police department in the apprehension of the armed robbery suspect and mentioned that the flags were at half-staff in recognition and honor of the police officer shot in Detroit.

City Manager Fernandez announced that the Marysville Dance Team is soliciting cans and bottles and people wishing to donate can contact the school and that the DPW No Shave November is coming to a close Wednesday at 10 a.m. and anyone interested in donating canned food items can do so until that time.

Mayor Damman expressed his thankfulness to serve with the council and city employees; announced the change of council meetings for December to the 1st and 3rd Mondays due to the holidays; gave a reminder of the goal setting meeting on December 12 at 6:30 p.m.; mentioned the Santa Parade on Saturday beginning at 5 p.m. at Village Green Plaza and ending in the Marysville Park by the train; thanked Duke Dunn, Boddy Construction, Paul Wessel, Charlie Peyerk and many others for their volunteer work on the golf course; and congratulated Ella Paterson who is receiving an award from University of Michigan for “Making a Difference in Your Community” for her fundraising efforts to add ADA compatible playground equipment to the park.
