

MINUTES OF THE MARYSVILLE CITY COUNCIL GOAL SETTING SESSION

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. City Manager Randy Fernandez gave opening remarks.
2. City Attorney Gary Fletcher gave an overview of Michigan's Recreational Marijuana Law that was recently passed. It was recommended that the city wait and see what changes are made in the lame duck session and how the actual laws and regulations are written for licenses to sell and grow the product. Nothing will happen before 2020 so there is no reason to rush into anything. More information will be coming on the procedure to opt out or ban the sale of marijuana within city boundaries.

Information was also given for employees that are not to be under the influence of marijuana while at work. Also, the DOT has a zero tolerance for employees with a CDL license. It remains to be seen how the drug tests will be used and improved upon over time.

3. The pros and cons of a resolution allowing golf carts on some city streets with restrictions put in place were discussed. The majority of council members were not in favor of putting the issue on a council agenda. As it stands now, it is illegal to drive a golf cart on any city streets.
4. Economic drivers were discussed as a way of making Marysville a destination place. Some of the ideas proposed were: Lake to Lake Bike Trail event; kite flying; hot air balloons; beer/wine fest; BBQ Pit Master; fishing clinic; walleye tournament; food truck competition; October Fest combined with a fishing tournament; a barge in the river with bands playing on it. More discussion will follow at a later date.
