CONSENT AGENDA:

Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Shirkey to approve the Consent Agenda.

1. Approved minutes of the Regular Meeting held on Monday, March 25, 2019.  
Motion passed unanimously.

ACTION AGENDA:

1. Moved by Council Member Wessel, supported by Council Member Badley to approve bills in the amount of \$141,310.69 and payroll for April 18, 2019. Motion passed unanimously.
2. Moved by Council Member Badley, supported by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman to approve payments to Shirkey Electric in the amount of \$1,088.89 for services at City Hall and the Community Center. Motion passed unanimously.
3. Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Barber to approve the lowest cost responsive bid amount of \$123,500.00 from Creative Asphalt of Imlay City, MI for paving work at the Marysville City Park. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Moved by Council Member Shirkey, supported by Council Member Badley to approve contract award recommendation for New City Hall, Bid Package #4 – Proposal #1 – metal framing and gypsum board, to Midwest Metal Construction of Avoca, MI with the lowest cost responsive bid amount of \$101,700.00. Motion passed unanimously.

FOLLOW UP BUSINESS:

1. Council Member Barber stated that gravel trucks leaving Blue Water Aggregate left a mess on Busha this past winter. DPW Director Barry Kreiner will contact the owner.
2. Mayor Damman noticed that the striping is nonexistent on Busha near the new Chrysler plant. Mr. Kreiner stated that Busha is on the county's maintenance schedule.

Council Member Badley thanked the first responders on all of their work and efforts the past weekend.
