3. Moved by Council Member Barber, supported by Council Member Shirkey to approve lowest cost responsive bid in the amount of \$63,100.00 from Raymond Excavating Co. of Marysville, MI for the dog park at Morton Park. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Badley to approve legal counsel to make necessary amendments to the Marysville City Code, Chapter 9, General City Employees Retirement, Sections 1.268-1.277, Retirement Conditions – (10 years service to vest/1.5% multiplier) for new employees effective on or after November 1, 2019 as outlined in Department Head, Assistant Department Head/First Line Supervisor, Clerical/Non Clerical Management Benefit Plan and TPOAM Bargaining Unit Members. Motion passed unanimously.

#### FOLLOW UP BUSINESS:

City Manager Randall Fernandez mentioned coyote sighting articles. He also stated that Building Inspector Sean Quain does a great job with building permits and asked residents to always check with the building department or the DPW to see if a permit is required.

#### MAYOR & COUNCIL/MANAGER COMMENTS:

Council Member Badley thanked the police department and Deputy Chief Buckmaster for a timely response to a situation of a concerned citizen, he is very appreciative of their public safety services.

Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman extended her well wishes to Mike Booth and the Finance Department during audit time; congratulated the Marysville Varsity Ladies Golf Team who won regionals and now move on to states; wished good luck to both coaches, families and supporters; reminded everyone to register to vote, to exercise their right to vote in person or via absentee ballot and to take advantage of this wonderful opportunity we all share.

Council Member Shirkey reminded all local business' to please participate in Christmas in the Park.

Council Member Barber thanked Phil Porte, BMJ, city manager and council for their support in helping with the dog park. These kinds of projects affect everybody and are a greater good for most of the people that we serve.

City Manager Fernandez mentioned leaf vac starts today and runs for eight weeks. He stated that we have an excellent public safety department and it is one of the top reasons why people live in Marysville. Vicksburg Hall is a fine institution and it is not a subsidy of City of Marysville.

Mayor Damman concurred with city managers comments; reminded everyone to register to vote before the November election; to educate yourself on the candidates and exercise your right to vote. He also mentioned that October 28<sup>th</sup> will be his last meeting as Mayor of Marysville.
