FOLLOW UP BUSINESS:

1. City Manager Fernandez scheduled a meeting with Mr. Weston of SCC Road Commission regarding snow plowing on Gratiot.
2. Mayor Pyden stated that leaf pickup is complete in Zone 1 and wished success for the rest of the week. Council Member Barber suggested looking at a better way to handle leaf pickup.
3. Council Member Badley inquired about the sinkhole on Busha Hwy.

MAYOR & COUNCIL/MANAGER COMMENTS:

Council Member Winston mentioned the tremendous turnout for the parade and Christmas in the Park.

Council Member Barber was sorry he could not attend the parade. He also stated that the new city hall building looks great.

Council Member Shirkey was glad to see people in attendance at the parade and thanked them; Christmas in the Park will continue through the holidays and voting continues through December 22 for the "Popular Vote Award".

Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman welcomed everyone to the City of Marysville's new home and commended the entire team on the move; mentioned that a Community Christmas Dinner will take place at the Marysville United Methodist Church on December 25 from 12:00 to 2:00 p.m., and to call 364-6333 for home delivery of a meal; and said we are very lucky to have Pastor Curtis Clarke in attendance tonight.

Council Member Badley thanked everyone who helped with the Santa Parade, it was bigger than ever; mentioned this is the last week for leaf pickup and thanked DPW and everyone involved with the move to the new city hall.

Council Member Wessel complimented the new city hall building; and said Christmas parade was nice and Santa was great.

City Manager Fernandez stated that we started the evening with a Goal Setting Session with discussion of being fiscally responsible; we are using old chairs which have been reupholstered in the council chambers; will continue to use old black chairs for council seating; the new building is energy efficient; and he will be meeting with RESA regarding the sale of the old city hall on Wednesday. He also mentioned that Ed Radske is being inducted into the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame.

Mayor Pyden was glad to see a great show of people at the parade and Christmas in the Park; hopes to have the Business Council host a breakfast for local businesses in January; and thanked everyone for attending the meeting and to have a great evening.
