- A. Moved by Council Member Wessel, supported by Council Member Winston to approve check disbursements from April 8, 2022, payroll for April 29, 2022 and electronic disbursements. Motion passed unanimously.
- B. Moved by Council Member Badley, supported by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman to approve Resolution to grant SEMCO Energy, Inc. permanent easement and authorize City Manager Randy Fernandez to execute and sign all documents pertaining to the easement. Motion passed unanimously.

- C. Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Badley to approve Resolution to adopt the 2022-2026 Parks and Recreation Master Plan. Motion passed unanimously.
- D. Moved by Council Member Badley, supported by Council Member Winston to approve lease agreement with FLOCK Safety for 60-day trial installation of 10 cameras with the option to continue lease for the quoted amount of \$2,500.00 per camera at the end of the trial period.
